Unauthorised Holidays

Children of school age who are registered at a school must, by law, attend that school regularly. Regular attendance is the best way of ensuring that a child makes the most of the educational opportunities which are available to him/her.

When a child is absent from school, he/she misses not only the teaching provided but is also less prepared for the lessons after his or her return. There are only 190 statutory school days in one year and 175 days (weekends

and school holidays) available to use for holidays. Therefore every school day counts!

Regulations make it clear that parents do not have any right or entitlement to take a child out of school for the purposes of a term time holiday.

If parents take their child on holiday in term time this will be counted as unauthorised absence - this is the same as truancy and you may be at risk of a penalty notice being applied.

YEAR 6 CAREERS EVENT

Exclusions

If your child has been excluded from school they must stay at home during school hours and not be in a public place.

If they are seen out during school hours Penalty Notices will be issued.

Penalty Notices

- The Penalty Notice fine is £60 per parent per child which rises to £120 if not paid within 21 days. If not paid after 28 days you may be prosecuted
- Parents in the Cambs. area have recently been given a four week suspended sentence for taking their child out of school during term time for the third time. They must complete 20 days of RAR (Rehabilitation Activity Requirement) and must also pay court costs of £165 each. The parents were warned that if they took their child on another term time holiday, the suspended prison sentence was likely to be activated and they would be jailed for 4 weeks.

Home Visits

Home visits may be undertaken if your school suspects the family is on holiday, and could result in your child being reported as Missing in Education
