Within Topic, we have an exciting term ahead of us. Children will learn about the Egyptian civilisation. They will gain an appreciation of the achievements of the Egyptians and their influence and legacy. They will also draw comparisons to other early civilisations studied during KS2. We are hoping to use timelines to place events in order, understand timeline can be divided into BC and AD and use words and phrases like century and decade.

We will then move onto using evidence to describe past: Houses and settlements, culture and leisure activities, clothes, way of life and actions of people, buildings and their uses people's beliefs and attitudes. Before we look at things of importance to people including the differences between lives of rich and poor and describing the similarities and differences between people, events and objects.

Hopefully at the end of the term we will be able to hold an Egyptian exhibition, where we can showcase all of our fantastic learning. This may have to be virtually though!

In Maths we have numerous areas to cover over the next term. We will begin with length, perimeter and area, before moving onto time. Following on from that we will move into aspects of geometry. Covering aspects of shape, including angles and symmetry. After that, areas of volume and capacity will be our focus. This will lead us into our final focus, which is statistics. Hopefully children can keep building coins up on TTRockstars as well, and keep our undefeated record going! We also have Purple Mash, which has lots of games to play and a weekly task set.

Guided Reading will take place in the classroom daily, alongside this, children will also be encouraged to read at home daily.

We will continue to come in PE kits on PE days, this will allow us to have even more time to really develop our skills in PE.

Well done to every child for finishing second in the Year 3/4 Sportshall Athletics Pentathlon competition. We had some amazing individual scores!

During English we are beginning our Summer term with Adventure and Mystery Stories, followed by Instructions and ending with Plays.

In Science this term we are focusing on Sound: How they are made, what is a vibration, how we hear, how pitch and volume alter the sound we hear and how distance alters the sound.
